Re: Interpreters Anisha Asadollahi and Keyvan Mohtadi

Your Excellency,

The undersigned representatives of the world language community, together with their academic and humanitarian partners, are gravely concerned that on May 9, 2022, Anisha Asadollahi and Keyvan Mohtadi, both Iranian citizens, were arrested and detained for serving as interpreters for two French nationals, Cécile Kohler and Jacques Paris, who likewise were arrested, in their case for "fomenting unrest."

Irrespective of the allegations leveled against Ms. Kohler and Mr. Paris, interpreters contracted to provide linguistic services must not be held legally accountable for the content of the communications they are facilitating. Interpreters worldwide are recognized as impartial intermediaries. In arresting and detaining Ms. Asadollahi and Mr. Mohtadi, Iran essentially criminalized the act of interpretation.

Moreover, the right to work in a given profession is a fundamental human right, as recognized in several international legal instruments, among them the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR), which your country ratified in 1975. Specifically, Article 6(1) of the latter lays down that "The States Parties to the present Covenant recognize the right to work, which includes the right of everyone to the opportunity to gain his living by work which he freely chooses or accepts, and will take appropriate steps to safeguard this right." Accordingly, the arrest and detention of the two interpreters constitute a clear violation of this covenant.

We respectfully urge your Excellency to intervene, directing the relevant governmental agencies to honor the rights enshrined in the ICESCR and immediately release Ms. Asadollahi and Mr. Mohtadi.
