Please note that in the previous fiscal year, only 50% of the membership had paid their dues by the end of August. This year, almost 66% of the membership had paid their dues by the end of August, so that meant that as an Association we collected a higher amount than expected (the remaining 50% from last year and 66% from this year, so about 16% higher than expected).
