We conducted a thorough revision of our Policy and Procedure Manual. This effort was long overdue and reflects our commitment to transparency, consistency, and professional standards. Looking ahead, there is growing optimism around our efforts to secure Title Protection. If all goes according to plan, we anticipate being able to apply by the spring of 2027. This would mark a significant milestone for the professional recognition of our members and the value of our work.

We've also made meaningful progress on the dossier requirements for interpreters. This has been a collaborative effort, and I hope to see the finalized materials posted on our website soon.

The Board are also addressing a pressing issue regarding our certified members in Indigenous languages. At present, the three individuals holding certification are unable to work with ATIA. We are actively working to resolve this situation and ensure that Indigenous language professionals are represented and supported within our association.

Our newsletter has proven to be a resounding success. It continues to be a rich source of information and connection for our members. We are confident that it will remain a cornerstone of our communications moving forward.

I want to take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to all the members of the Board for their dedication and valuable insights throughout the year. I would also like to express my heartfelt appreciation to Allison and Kea for the invaluable support they provided. Their commitment and professionalism have been instrumental in keeping our operations running smoothly.
